

Dr George V. Apostolopoulos, Executive member of the BOD:

Mr Apostolopoulos was born in Corinth.

He founded the Athens Medical Center in 1984.

He is an economist, holding a degree in Economics from the Higher School of Economic and Commercial Studies (ASOEE) and a doctorate from Middlesex University in London, UK.

He has written numerous books on the Organisation and Administration of Hospitals and taught as a visiting professor at the Athens Technological Education Institute (TEI).

He has received major awards from the Greek State for his business activities, including an accolade from the Chamber of Commerce and Industry as Most Successful Self-Made Entrepreneur.

In 2003 he was presented with the “Leaders of the Year” prize for being consistently on the list of the “20 Entrepreneurs with the best reputation in Greece”.

He served as Chairman of the Board of Directors from the founding of the Athens Medical Group until 2025.

Since January 2026, he is Honorary Chairman and Executive Member of the Board of Directors.

Dr Vassili G. Apostolopoulos, Chairman, executive member of the BOD:

Mr Apostolopoulos was born in Athens.

He graduated from the Moraitis School in 1990. He holds a BSc in Management (Hons) from the London School of Economics, an MBA from the University of Cambridge and a doctorate from the University of Athens.

He is since January 2026 Chairman of the BoD and previously held the position of the CEO of the Athens Medical Group, a leader in the health industry in Greece and Southeastern Europe. He also serves as CEO of the family Holding company (G. Apostolopoulos Holdings S.A.). He is the Honorary Consul of the Principality of Monaco in our country, as well as Honorary President and a member of the Board of Directors of the Hellenic Association of Entrepreneurs (EENE) of which he served as president for one decade, and is a member of the General Council of the Hellenic Federation of Enterprises (SEV), the Greek

Health Tourism Council (ELITOUR) and the Greek-Qatari Business Council. He is also a member of the Advisory Board of the Hellenic Observatory of the London School of Economics, the Centre for International Business and Management (CIBAM) of the University of Cambridge and the Chatham House think tank in London.

Additionally, he is the President of the Hellenic Alumni Association of LSE (HAALSE) and Second Chairman of the 'Athens Club', the most historic gentlemen's club in Greece, as well as Honorary Consul of Montenegro in Thessaloniki.

He is a founder of the 'DIELPIS PERI AGONON' association, which aims at promoting motor sports in Greece, and a founding member and director of the Cyber Security International Institute (CSII), which aims at educating and informing the public in general and children in particular on the proper use and threats of cyberspace.

Mr Apostolopoulos has won numerous accolades and distinctions for his charitable work, business endeavours and diverse contributions. In 2008, he was awarded the 'Giuseppe Sciacca' international award for his social and humanitarian work. Moreover, he was presented with an award by the Commandant of the Hellenic Coast Guard for his contribution to the corps and by the Athens Police Officers' Union for his contribution to the police officers of Attica. He has received an award from the Federation of Hellenic Societies of Greater New York for his contribution to diaspora Greeks living in New York.

In 2020, he was presented with the British Council's Lifetime Achievement Award, the first time it was conferred on a Greek citizen.

In May 2021, he received the 'Leadership in Healthcare & Corporate Social Responsibility' award during the Maria Callas Monaco Gala & Awards, held under the patronage of Prince Albert II of Monaco, for his leadership in the crucial field of health during the battle against the pandemic and for his social contributions.

In October 2021, he received the 'World Eminent Man of Leadership in Health & Entrepreneurship' award of the 'Who is Who International Awards' international organisation for his contributions to health, entrepreneurship and society as CEO of the Athens Medical Group and President of the Hellenic Association of Entrepreneurs.

In February 2022, he was named 'Pioneering Entrepreneur of 2021' for his business activities as part of the EY 'Entrepreneur of the Year' contest.
